Role title: Learning & Development

Reports to: Learning & Development Co-Ordinator

Role purpose:

To deliver learning opportunities to a range of age groups and abilities. Groups are primary school age; however, there will be opportunities to work within the community on educational projects.

You may be required to undertake an Enhanced DBS the role which the Museum will facilitate, if required.

Time commitment:

This role operates flexibly depending on the arranged visits and groups to the museum. The learning & development co-ordinator arranges all visits. These will be discussed based on the educational team's availability. This role operates over a full calendar year, but the time commitment is as-hoc.

Main duties and responsibilities:

- Helping with preparation, delivery of the education sessions.
- Tasks main include, supervising safe procedures, developing new activities.
- Practical activities including craft sessions.
- Attend informal planning meetings organised by the Learning & Development Co-ordinator.

Skills, experience and qualities:

- Enthusiasm and excellent communication skills.
- A calm approach.
- Willingness to work with children and adults from a wide range of backgrounds and with differing abilities.
- Team player.
- A capacity for understanding the needs of others.
- Former experience in working in an educational environment is desirable, however training will be given.
- A sense of fun.

The role is open to all. We welcome applications from people of all abilities, backgrounds and communities.

We are looking for people with an interest in local history and that of the Museum. It is important to be able to work with a wide range of people.
