The Spring Lecture, held at the Golf Hotel in early April, was a great success. It featured the story of the war time evacuees. A story told with great passion by Ken Argent, who now lives in Horncastle. Ken was evacuated from Hornchurch in Essex to Birmingham at a very tender age. He made us realise the trauma that this inflicted on the children and their families.

He brought along a number of exhibits to illustrate what children had to suffer. These included children's gas masks and a contraption which babies had to be put in to keep them safe from gas attacks. He described how his baby sibling screamed when put in this device, He also described how on his return to home, after some three years, he was ostracised because he and his brother had picked up the Birmingham accent. He was told he was posh!

The event was very well attended, with well over 60 attending and raised much needed funds for the museum



From the Collection - JOHN WIELD'S BIRTHPLACE

The photographic archive of the late 'Bill' Skelton, the well-known local journalist was donated to the Museum. Among the photographs was an image of a house by the side of a straight road. Written on the reverse, probably, in Bill's hand, we have, the birth place of John Wield. Where this was and if it still existed had to be ascertained



History tells us that John's father Thomas and his wife came to Lincolnshire in c.1875 and resided at 'Edlington'. However, no road similar to that in the photograph exists at Edlington village. The road does look very familiar to Stixwould Road going out of Woodhall to Stixwould. Examination of early maps shows the area on the west of Stixwould Road was called 'Edlington Moor' even though it is some miles from Edlington village. In the 1881 census Thomas describes himself as a ...grazer of 14 acres at Edlington. Could this be a corruption of Edlington Moor?

A present-day image from the same viewpoint provides a possible answer. This shows the Village Limits Motel and Restaurant. Closer examination shows that the original house is still there, now totally engulfed by later extensions and alterations but architectural features common to both are discernible.

Thomas later moved to the Bungalow to work at the Baths and eventually set up his Bath-chair business







Advertisement for the house in Axle Cooling

This may have been one of the buildings "Mellow Observer" had in mind when, in 1890, he wrote, "Woodhall Spa is bright and new with well-built residences, commodious and drained, durable and compact and surrounded by gardens."

I note in the advertisement that as well as, "every home comfort," the house is "warmed throughout." Today, of course, we would not expect otherwise.

How interesting that it was furnished by Maples, the well-known London firm. Some years after this, heiress Grace Maple, came to Woodhall Spa to take the waters. She later became Lady Weigall of Petwood.

At the beginning of the 20th century, Hartington House became Woodhall Spa High School for Girls. The day girls and boarders were educated to Cambridge Matriculation level, and had visiting tutors for subjects such as art, dancing and music; only French was spoken at lunchtime. The girls were expected to behave as young ladies in deportment, conversation and dress; gloves must always be worn outdoors. The successful school remained at Hartington House

for some 25 years before the property reverted to being a guest house.

It is still a handsome building, standing on the Broadway, witness to over a century of change in traffic and fashion. Now it is composed of privately owned apartments.





The Season is in full swing in Woodhall Spa but we used to have far more visitors. People blame the destruction of the Victoria Hotel but the Baths are not doing well.




The Spa Bath Building
