



"Tales from the Tower" - The Spring Talk

The Cottage Museum spring talk 'Tales from the Tower' will take place at the Golf Hotel, Woodhall Spa, on Saturday12th April at 2.30pm. Doors open at 2pm. The speaker will be Keith Hanson RVM, former Yeoman warder of the Tower of London and latterly Chief Exhibitor responsible for the safety, security and presentation of the Crown Jewels. Keith was awarded the Royal Victoria Medal in 2020 for service to the Crown. Tickets cost £8.50, including refreshments and will be available from 6th March online. From Tuesday 18th March tickets can be obtained from Museum Reception during Museum opening hours (Tuesday to Saturday from 10.30am to 4.00pm.) Pre booking is essential. There will also be a raffle.

New Windows for the Museum

The Cottage Museum building was originally erected for the Wield family in 1887. It is believed that the window frames are original and after 137 years were showing their age. It definitely had become a constant battle to keep them in good repair and so the decision was taken to replace them throughout the whole This is building. not straight forward as it may seem, building is in Conservation Area.

The Conservation Officer for East Lindsey was contacted before work commenced and we were given the go ahead subject to the design of the frames being an exact copy for the old ones.

Tom Johnson took on the job of finding a suitable company to make these special frames and he has overseen the whole job. A number of the frames were in very bad condition, which in itself is not surprising, given the time they have been in place. Thanks to a legacy and a grant the frames were handmade by Carres Heritage, a conservation firm in Sleaford. The grant was part funded by the UK Government through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund and distributed by East Lindsey District Council and helped pay for the final part of the project which entailed replacing the windows in the "War Room". Getting to the war room windows was particularly difficult and it took four volunteers to move the cabinet from in front of the window to be replaced and returned afterwards. Their help was invaluable and given at short notice, so ensuring the terms of the grant were met.

It is hoped the new frames will last as long as the original ones!

He was a natural designer and builder, capable of improvising in all situations, a skill which saved his life and that of his colleagues on many occasions.





From the Collection - The Lunn Sisters

The March 2024 article was devoted to the Williams sisters. In this newsletter we turn to the other spinster sisters who were important to the village, namely the Lunn sisters.

Susanna and Katherine (or Catherine) Lunn were of great benefit to Woodhall Spa, in establishing a school for ladies in the village at Hartington House which prospered for over 25 years.

They hailed from Horncastle where their father, Henry, was a grocer and chemist on Bridge St. He prospered employing not only his son in the business but also four apprentices and two servants at his home. Henry and his wife, Susanna had eleven children. Our sisters were the 4th and 5th.

Susanna, the eldest of our sisters and the main-stay behind their future endeavours, was educated at the Penrhos College, an independent private school for girls, near Colwyn Bay in Wales. She was obviously well thought of as she taught English at her *alma mater* in 1891. Teaching was her love and she returned to Horncastle to set up her own establishment, initially above her father's shop, but soon moving with her sister Florence to 54, West Street in the town.

Their ethos, of a thorough education and to prepare young ladies for the world in front of them became a success and the need to expand was soon upon them. Thus, they moved to Woodhall Spa early in the 20th century, joined by their younger sister, Katherine to act as matron, as she had obtained a nursing qualification. The premises they chose was a previous boarding house, Hartington House, situated in the heart of the village and with much more accommodation. By the time of the 1911 census the school was a resounding success with 18 pupils ranging in age from 10-16. The teaching staff included four assistants, these together with a cook, housekeeper and two housemaids.

As the new century progressed more accommodation was required and the adjacent large building called Victoria Lodge, but which the sisters named Hartington Lodge, so as to associate it with the school, was purchased.

Or he may have been tempted by a more frivolous purchase, for Mr. Carlton was also a photographer advertising his newly opened studio. Photographic studios had become popular in the last forty years or so but Mr. Carlton may also have been inspired by the photos of amateur but highly successful, Mr Johnny Wield, in

the bungalow next door (now the Cottage Museum.)

I imagine the souvenir of the Spa would be popular, as unlike today, these were times of limited and cumbersome cameras.


