With a life-long passion for singing and working in communities, Liz McIntosh leads the singers with warmth, humour and enthusiasm and believes that singing with others is a fundamental community building activity and that singing is for everyone



<u>Sunday August 14th - "Between the Lines"</u> - This group are a highly popular and successful Lincolnshire Folk Band. These local heroes have gone to another level since the addition of guitar and mandolin maestro Dave Tucker, who provides the perfect counterfoil to the dynamic vocals of Phil Biggs and John Blanks. With three songwriters in the band and a huge repertoire of Americana as well, the band offers so much to enjoy.


"Axle Cooling" - a very rare booklet

This is the delightful front cover of the article entitled "Axle Cooling," written by a "mellow observer" in 1890.

It shows the pretty grounds of the Spa, complete with deer, rustic fencing and several trees for which Woodhall was famous. It is dominated by a bandstand peopled by a few gentlemen, perhaps members of the Spa Band, which played at regular intervals during the day throughout the Season. Behind the bandstand is Doctor's house and on the left is a verandah running along the side of the Baths and the triangular pediment of the Pump Room.

It appears the observer was indeed in need of aid. He writes that he "elects to cool his axle, by repairing his body and balancing his mind under the wear and tear complaint." "With stiffened joints and a dry cough but with a feeble expectancy flickering in his darkened mind," he was swathed in shawls and transported to the terminus of the Great Northern Railway, where he was "wedged in a corner" of a train to be conveyed to Woodhall Spa.

This event is normally hugely successful and given the time that has elapsed since the last 40s weekend it could well be bigger than ever.



New Book on Royal Jubilee Park

A new publication is now on the shelves at the Cottage Museum that complements the first two volumes depicting images from the archives of the Woodhall Spa Cottage Museum, those being "The Gardens of Petwood" and "Taking the Waters at Woodhall Spa".

The research for this book has centred on Jubilee Park in Woodhall Spa and was suggested by one of the Trustees of JPWS Ltd. The title of the book is "Royal Jubilee Park" with images again taken from the archives of the Woodhall Spa Cottage Museum.

The history of this beautiful recreational area is detailed from the time of its ownership as a field by Grace Weigall of Petwood House. She envisaged constructing gardens and sports grounds to be laid out for her intended Bath house. Photographs and copies of documents in the possession of the Museum have been used to illustrate the history. The story takes us from the 1920s, to the laying of the Foundation Stone for the Bath house in 1935, the gift of 1947 and on to the present day with the latest acquisition of a fitness suite, the sensory garden and wood



From the Collection

THE PELL CUP

For all those keen on bowls amongst our membership, I relate an interesting story, with the accompanying photographs from the museum archive, which occurred annually in Woodhall in August from 1933 to 1938. In the archive there are a total of eight photographs, all taken at the same place but in different years.

Edwin Pell (1909-1967) was a local councillor but not a local man. Both he and his wife Edith née Johnson (1910-1993) originated from Sheffield, Yorkshire. They married in 1931. He was the son of a fish merchant and came to Woodhall with his wife and two children in the late 1920s. He built an imposing detached house in 1928 on Witham Road and called it 'Duncannon'. He became a builder constructing a number of houses in Woodhall Spa.



Edwin was keen on bowls and while in Woodhall created and maintained an excellent 2-rink bowls green on the lawn to the rear of his house as well as setting up the Woodhall Spa Bowling Club in about 1930. He initiated annual bowls competition for members of the club. Qualifying rounds were played at the Golf Club greens but the semi-finals and final always took place on his own green. The occasion was

attended by both competitors and spectators sitting in deck-chairs as can be seen from the image above. This is the semi-finals of 1934. The players on the green are left to right, Mr. Peppercorn, Mr Wattam, the eventual winner, Mr.Lister and Mr.Tyler.

The first prize trophy was originally a modest but still substantial affair, but at his own expense, he later donated a magnificent silver trophy known as 'The Pell Cup' (illustrated left with the replica) which was presented to the winner for them to keep for the year. It was surmounted, as was the runner up trophy, by a crown bowl. A small replica was given to the winner to keep. Even the other prizes were of the highest quality. Unfortunately, the current whereabouts of this trophy is unknown but apparently the lid is with the Woodhall Town Bowls Club.

Edwin captained the team of the Woodhall Bowling Club against Sir Archibald Weigall's team at the opening of the sports grounds at Jubilee Park in April 1934. Edwin's team were the winners. Just over a year later the Park itself was opened. The image left below shows Edwin Pell with his daughter, Dorothy and Sir Archibald Weigall at the 1934 Pell competition at which Dorothy presented the prizes. Note how immaculately dressed they are.

Edwin's son, also an Edwin, also came to live in Woodhall with his family. He built a house on the Horncastle Road and named it Norfolk Lodge. When Edwin senior retired from his community positions, he and his son exchanged houses but took their own house names with them. Hence 'Duncannon' on Witham Road became 'Norfolk Lodge'. The name remains to this day.

Edwin Pell died at a relatively young age. His widow continued to live at 'Duncannon' on Horncastle Road until 1977 when she moved to a small bungalow, Maple Lodge, on the Broadway. She remained there until her death in 1993.

This is a condensed version of a much more detailed monograph on Edwin Pell I researched, which is in the museum archive.





Dear Readers,


In my last letter I said that the Royal Hotel was being converted into flats. By April six were taken.


In the middle of May, I came out of the bakery and walked down the Broadway. There was a gathering of people outside Morton's, the printer at number five. Apparently, a young bullock belonging to Mr. Bourne, the butcher on the Broadway, was being taken to the slaughter house on Witham Road when it became restive and blundered into the shop! It viewed itself in a large showcase for some seconds before with "a little persuasion," it walked calmly out. (Perce snorted at that, "persuasion" he said, "it was a beast, not a pet puppy.")



The "Royal"

It is only fifteen years ago, in May 1897, that the Royal Hotel received its first visitors. Then, the next month, like the rest of the village, it was bedecked with flags and banners to commemorate the Diamond Jubilee of Queen Victoria. The day was a holiday, of course, with sports and competitions and teas. In the morning a band led a procession of residents and children in their Sunday best, to St. Peter's Church for a service of thanksgiving for Her Majesty's long reign.

The bullock, with its harassed-looking herdsman crossed the railway lines and passed the Mall but at the Royal it became unruly again, suddenly swerved to its left and Lordy me! It crashed into a large window of the flat owned by Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence, causing not a little alarm.

Visitors witnessing the incident were astonished. They select this country spa and then frequently are surprised by manifestations of rural life.




Samuel Redshaw's shop bedecked with bunting for Queen Victoria's Jubilee in 1897
